

The Alii Nui Bernice Pauahi Bishop was born on the 19th day of Dec. 1831. She was descended from the royal house of Keawe-ikekahi - alii - oka - moku, a direct descendant of Umi and Liloa celebrated King in Hawaiian history and as far back as Wakia and Papa.

Her parents were the high chiefs Paki and Konia, whose genealogy I give in the following table:

Being asked as to my relationship to the Princess Pauahi, I give my genealogy (because at the time of my birth I was taken away from my parents, the high chiefs Kapaakea and Keohokolole by Paki and Konia Pauahi having been and brought up as their own adopted by Kinau and because we were descended from the same ancestors.

Alapaiwahine was the sister of King Kaleiopuu Kamanawa and Kaoleioku were first cousins. My father and Konia were second cousins. Bernice and I are third cousins.

From the date of Pauahi's birth, she was adopted by the Princess Kinau, daughter of Kamehameha I and was brought up as their

own child. She was at this early age betrothed to Prince Lot Kamehameha and was to be considered as his future wife.

When the school for the Royal children was established in 1839, Pauahi, aged 8 years, was one of the earliest pupils who entered at the same time with her foster brothers, Princes Moses Kekuaiwa, Lot Kamehameha, Alexander Liholiho. There was besides these Jane Loeau and her sister Abigail Maheha, two ladies of high birth.

It was in the year 1842 that Paki and Konia decided that I should be sent to school at the same time with the Princess Victoria Kamamalu we both of us being four years old. William Lunalilo, James Kaliokalani, my eldest brother, Peter Young Kaeo and David Kalakaua, Emma Rooke, Elizabeth Kekaaniau had entered already two years previous. It was arranged that I should share with Bernice her room. On rising in the morning we had to share the care of our room and here I must say she was scrupulously careful in all details. The morning devotions brought teachers and scholars together in the parlor to offer praise, after
