Kiwalao succeeded his father Kaleiopuu to the throne of Hawaii and had for wife Kekui, (daughter of Kamanawa (k) and Piilani) and had issue:

Keopuolani (w)

Keopuolani was wahine (~~manuahi~~) of Kamehameha I and they had issue:

Liholiho-----Kamehameha II

Kauikeouli---Kamehameha III

Nahienaena. (w)

These three died without issue.

Kamehameha I afterwards had a wahine ~~manuahi~~, Kaniu, (daughter of Keaumoku, King of Maui) and his wife, Namahana) and had issue:

Kamamalu (w) died childless

Kinau (w)

Kinau married Kekuanaoa, (son of Nahiolea, spittoon bearer of Kiwalao, and Kiilaweau his wife). Kekuanaoa in his youth was ai puupuu of Kamehameha I and then spittoon bearer of Kamehameha II and Kamehameha III.

Kinau and Kekuanaoa had issue:

Kamehameha, who died in childhood,

Moses who died when 20 years old.

Lot-----Kamehameha V

Alexander Liholiho--Kamehameha IV

Victoria Kamamalu.

Kealiimaikai was younger and only brother of Kamehameha I and son of Keoua (younger brother of Kaleiopuu) and his wife Kekui. Kealiimaikai had for wife Kaliko and had issue

Kaonaeha w.

Kekela married Nae'a (k) a Chief of Maui, and had issue:

Emma (adopted daughter of Dr. Rooke)

Emma married Kamehameha IV and had issue the Prince of Hawaii who died young.

Kaniu, the wahine ~~manuahi~~ of Kamehameha I before this amour had a daughter by her husband Kaleimamahū, son of Piipii (w) and Kalanihelemauluna (k) who was younger brother of Keoua and therefore cousin of Kamehameha I.

This daughter of Kaniu and Kaleimamahū was named Kekauluohi<sup>(w)</sup> who married Kanaina, son of Inaina, a chief of Napoo<sup>poo,</sup> Kona, Hawaii and wife of Keawepaikanaka.

Kanaina and Kekauluohi had issue:

The latter third married Kalanihelemailuna, a chief on Hawaii and had issued Aikanaka (k) who married Kamae, daughter of Puhalahua (k) and -----(w).

The latter had issue Keohokalole (w) who married Kapaakea the son of Kamanawa who poisoned his wife Kaapuiki. Keohokalole and Kapaakea had issue:
