Papa Kuhikuhi

Program

Puka (Opening)

- * Kāhea Pū – Richard Bell begins the Ceremony with the blowing of the Pū (conch shell).
- * Kawaiaha'o Church and St. Andrew's Cathedral begin Bell tolling.
- * Council of Hawaiian Organizations light four torches to reflect day torch burning Kapu.
- * Ha'i 'ōlelo - Emcee Palani Vaughan announces the performance of the *Iwikauikaua* Chant by John Ke•ola•maka•āinana•ka•lāhui•o•Ka•Lani•no•Kamehameha•'Ekolu Lake.
- * Royal Serenade - *Ku'u Pua o Paoakalani* played by the Royal Hawaiian Band.
- * Kāhea Pū – Richard Bell.
- * 'Oli - Three chants performed by Wendell Kalanikapu'aenui Silva:
 - (1) Clearing of the Path.
 - (2) Chant to Queen Lili'uokalani.
 - (3) Blessing of the people.
- * Pule - Rev. William Kaina.
- * Pule - Rev. Darrow 'Aiona.
- * Welcome - Senator Eloise Ululani Tungpalan.
- * Addresses - Dignitaries:
 - Governor John Waihe'e
 - Senator Daniel Inouye
 - Senator Daniel Akaka
 - Representative Patsy Mink
 - Representative Neil Abercrombie
 - Mayor Frank F. Fasi
 - OHA Chairman Clayton Hee

- * The Royal Hawaiian Band plays the *Queen's Prayer* with Palani Vaughan singing and translating, while Reverend Kaina blesses the Queen's statue and the audience with water.
- * Trustee Kamaki Kanahale tells the story of his Great Grandmother's ho'okupu to Queen Lili'uokalani and presents the 100 year old *Makalapua* chant, which has never been performed in public since his Great Grandmother's presentation.
- * The family of Naha Haku'ole present their musical Ho'okupu led by Mrs. Agnes L. Kalanihookaha Cope, Mrs. Ho'aliku Drake, and Mr. Myron Thompson.
- * The Royal Hawaiian Band plays 'O *Makalapua*. We ask the audience to join the band in singing 'O *Makalapua* as the dignitaries and guests present red and yellow blossoms in the calabash at the base of the statue of Her Majesty Queen Lili'uokalani.
- * Mr. and Mrs. Larry Mehau and Family present a musical ho'okupu by Don Ho and Leo Anderson Akana with an interpretation of *Kaulana Nā Pua*. The Mehau family present their flowers to the Queen during the performance.
- * Brickwood Galuteria and the Royal Hawaiian Band perform *Aloha 'Oe* as the 'Onipa'a Centennial Committee places flowers in the calabash.
- * At the closing of the program, 100 blossoms (nā pua) in a bouquet (pōkē pua) representing each year since the overthrow will be placed at the base of Queen Lili'uokalani's statue.

Let these flowers convey a convergence of those spirits of the past with ours of the present.
