

NOTE.—IN REGARD TO ITEM 3 BELOW: If you have made your own arrangements for billeting, and are unable to pass through your EVACUATION CENTER en route, immediately upon arrival at your destination give to the BLOCK WARDEN there the attached registration form.

## EVACUATION INSTRUCTION CARD—DISTRICT **A**

(SEE MAP ON BACK OF CARD)

1. AN AIR-RAID ALARM IS NOT AN EVACUATION ORDER. Do not leave your home at an air-raid alarm. Just seek shelter in your splinter trench.
2. AN EVACUATION ORDER WILL BE ISSUED BY THE MILITARY GOVERNOR WHEN HE THINKS IT NECESSARY.
3. Take this card and map with you if you evacuate your home.
4. It is hoped that evacuation will take place during daylight hours, in an orderly manner, with sufficient time to enable all necessary arrangements.
5. All women and children (except boys over 15) will be advised (not compelled) to evacuate if they live makai the red line, and go to safer areas mauka.
6. Evacuees may make their own arrangements in advance of the evacuation order and move if they wish into safer areas. Anyone changing address will notify the Registration Office at Kaahumanu School. Enemy aliens must secure permission to move, from the Police Department.
7. Evacuees will be directed to a billet if they have not made previous arrangements with friends or relatives in safer areas, to whom they may go.
8. Upon leaving home each evacuee will take along an evacuation kit containing the following:  
2 blankets; 4 days' supply of food, preferably canned or cooked; change of clothing; toilet articles including soap, towel and toilet paper; medicines as needed; waterproof coat or other waterproof covering; flashlight; can-opener, gas mask, cup, plate, knife, fork, and spoon. Be prepared to pay a reasonable charge for your accommodations to the person who cares for you. Credit will be allowed for your food, if used.
9. Evacuees may go in automobiles, but no automobile will be allowed to leave the precinct unless filled to capacity. Or evacuees may walk to the assembly point. Serviceable shoes for protection against broken glass, etc., are desirable.
10. Men and boys over 15 are required by order of the Military Governor to remain in their precincts to help fight fires, etc. Women and girls employed at work that must go on, may remain in their homes or places of work.
11. Evacuation procedures are directed by the Evacuation Committee, under the supervision of the Provost Marshal.
12. It is hoped that an evacuation period will last only a short time, probably a few days, after which evacuees may return to their homes when notified by the Military Governor. Ask your Warden for needed information and further details. During evacuation, call the Evacuation Center where you first reported, for necessary information.
