Ihi <sup>(like)</sup>	Spear to be thrown, about twelve feet long.
Pololu	A short spear which was generally used by two hands as a bayonet; about six to seven feet long.
Laau palau	A club about three to four feet long.
Kuia	A wooden dagger.
Lei o manu <sup>manu?</sup>	A large shark's tooth set in a piece of wood about two and a half inches long, with a ring of string for attaching to the finger. Held in the palm of the hand.
<sup>e</sup> Ihi lau meki. <sup>make?</sup>	A pronged spear.
Ko i pahoa	Stone battle axe.
Newa pahoa	Stone head of battle axe.
Maa	Sling stone
